
Peace and Stability Operations: An Evolving Practice (DS526)

- Functional-historical approach
 - Evolving functions from first to fourth generation
- Explores techniques & technologies
 - Military, police & civilian
 - Robust peacekeeping and enforcement
- Successes & failures (case studies)
- Experiences from the field
 - Guest speakers, documentaries & movies
- Student Evaluation
 - Participation, Current Affairs (Media) Analysis, UNSC

Peacekeeping Simulation:

New Medium for Scenario-based Education



- Hybrid teaching
 - In class or remote or BOTH
 - Run software any time / any place
 - Progress at players own level & speed
 - Automatic assessment
 - Supplement with instructor observations
- Many scenarios possible
 - UN Military Observers, Police
 - Protection of civilians
 - Civilian child protection advisers
 - Human rights
- Current testing in military training centres in Nepal, Bangladesh, Kenya & UN
- Many improvements possible
 - Multiplayer
 - VR
 - Metaverse





Dallaire Centre of Excellence in Peace and Security: Background and Mandate

June 2019 MND directed and personally announced the establishment of a CAF Centre of Excellence to serve as an enduring platform on the prevention and use of child soldiers, with the flexibility to eventually expand its scope to other emerging, human security topics within the Defence mandate.

- Serves as a Defence enabler to advance related GOC international objectives through the enhancement of and contribution to Defence capabilities.
- Initial focus on research and advancing CAF doctrine, training and education related to preventing the recruitment and use of child soldiers to leverage Canada's leadership on this topic (Vancouver Principles).
- Established within the existing architecture of the Canadian Defence Academy

Recognized for expertise in peace and security issues that increases CAF individual, operational, and institutional capabilities and advances Government of Canada objectives.


Strategic Objectives
