

Infusion of Peace Education into Professional Military Education is Necessary

Implementation is difficult Teaching peace to military is complex, challenging Although not undoable, requires adaptations **PEACE EDUCATION: A Transformative Response to Major Societal Challenges**

Peace Education: "A systematic education that builds in every individual the universal values and behaviors necessary for nurturing a culture of peace."

- includes the ability of people to prevent conflicts by proposing viable alternatives to violence
- Peace education = means of creating culture of peace

Purpose of peace education – foster a commitment to the ways of peace including resort to nonviolent means of resolving conflicts


No Requirement for Infusing Peace Education into Professional Military Education ?

Focus - Incorporation of peace education into mainstream education

No explicit requirement for infusion into military education



The cornerstone of military education will continue to be sustaining/enhancing operational capability



Infusing peace education into military is not easy

But not an impossible venture !

- Peace Education is essential
- Culture of war has not produced the desired peace
- Culture of war has only produced oppressive, violent

social structures



yes, it's going to be hard but hard is not impossible.

There is need for peace education in the military, but not in the nature and manner propounded by UNESCO

CONFLICT MANAGEMENT

Curriculum needs to be expanded to intermediate & elementary levels

Yes, approach will not lead to creation of culture of peace A long shot!

But could:

- raise consciousness of the perils of the culture of war
- raise critical awareness of factors inhibiting positive peace and other peace related issues
- Foster understanding of conflict resolution alternatives

Over time

military will have a mass of people, equipped with the capacities to approach issues with open and critical attitudes

who collectively will be able to navigate conflicts without resorting to violence
